

## NATIONAL SURVEY Paramedics and Paramedicine Perception

**Conducted for the Paramedics Association of Canada** (PAC)

**April 2023** 

### **METHODOLOGY**

- Sample size: 3,150 Canadians aged 18 and over.
- Survey field dates: April 24 to 28, 2023.
- The data was weighted by region, age, gender and education.
- Totals may not add up to 100 due to rounding.



### **Executive summary**

Healthcare remains a top-of-mind issue and Canadians are in support of paramedics initializing treatment and making decisions in emergency situations.

Since the last survey in 2021:

- Replacing healthcare as the top issue facing Canadians today is the economy (34%). Though, healthcare remains one of the top issues for Canadians. 25% rate it as the most important issue facing Canada a 10-point decrease from 2021.
- More Canadians believe that "emergency room wait times and capacity", "hospital overcrowding" and "access to a family doctor" are a major problem than in 2021 (each increasing 9-points or more).
- Respect for paramedics remains very high and is consistent with 2021. 62% say they have a lot of respect for paramedics just below firefighters (66%) and the same as nurses (62%) but higher than doctors (59%). 91% have considerable respect or more of paramedics.
- 57% of Canadians believe paramedics play a central role in healthcare (unchanged since 2018). Only doctors and registered nurses are viewed by more as being central.
- 61% also consider paramedics to be central to public safety, just less than firefighters and more so than police officers.
- Canadians remain split on whether paramedics are health care providers or emergency responders. 25% think health care, 40% think emergency responder, while 35% think both equally.
- Nearly all Canadians continue to believe that paramedics are highly educated and specifically trained professional healthcare providers and they can play a larger role in delivering healthcare to Canadians.
- 82% trust paramedics to make on-the-spot medical decisions up 5-points since 2018, and no change from 2021.
- While awareness of community paramedics remains low (14%), 83% support the idea when given more information about it. Only 2% are opposed.
- A majority believe that if they call 911 for a paramedic they expect to be taken to a hospital though 65% feel that a paramedic should have able to decide whether
  there is a more effective treatment than going to the hospital. In the case of emergency medical care, most (81%) would be comfortable receiving initial treatment
  by a paramedic.
- Violence and assault towards paramedics is perceived as a minor or major problem (84%) in Canada, and that it's either getting worse (36%) or staying the same (49%) few (15%) feel it's improving. Most support including paramedics in the Criminal Code.






## **EXPECTED TO GO TO THE HOSPITAL AFTER A 911 CALL?**




